
The City of Chicago Heights

Sec. 2-231. Lowest responsible bidder.

In consideration of the work to be performed in and for various forms of services, materials, public improvements or construction projects the factors to be considered in determining the "lowest responsible bidder", other than the lowest competitive price for the bid materials or work shall include, but not be limited to the following:

- (1) Compliance with all applicable laws prerequisite to doing business in Illinois and in the city.
- (2) Evidence of compliance with:
 - a. Federal employer tax identification number or Social Security Number (for individual);
 - b. Provisions of section 2000(e) of chapter 21, title 42 of the United States Code and Federal Executive Order No. 11246 as amended by Executive Order No. 11375 (known as the equal opportunity employer provisions).
- (3) Certificates of insurance indicating the following coverage: General liability, worker's compensation, completed operations, automobile, hazardous occupation, product liability, and professional liability.
- (4) Compliance with all provisions of the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act, including wages, medical and hospitalization insurance and retirement for those trades as covered in the Act.
- (5) Participation in apprenticeship and training programs approved and registered with the United States Department of Labor's Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training.
- (6) Evidence for historical reputation in the industry and community relative to past work related performance, resources and ability to successfully complete the work description subject of the bid description.
- (7) Evidence of ability to reinvest revenue, resources and jobs into the corporate limits of the city beyond the term of the scope of the bid work.
